A Church That Sows Seeds of Love Through Thanks-Giving

One of Zion church's members recently brought me some *jujubes*—sweet, crisp fruits picked from a tree in his backyard. Each bite carries the taste of autumn's joy. Breathing in the cool, refreshing air of morning and evening, my heart feels lighter. Once again, we have entered the season of *Thanksgiving*.

When I walk Joy through the neighborhood, I see homes adorned with pumpkins, corn husks, and lanterns, all celebrating the abundance of fall. Just as nature overflows with color and fullness, I pray that your homes, too, may be filled with joy and gratitude this season.

Farmers can harvest in the fall because they first sowed seeds in the spring and tended them with sweat and care through the summer. They can scatter seeds on empty ground because they believe and hope that life will sprout from those tiny seeds—bearing fruit thirty, sixty, or a hundredfold. With that same faith, we too are called to sow seeds.

Trusting that God will bring those seeds to life, may we become a church that sows seeds of love through *Thanks-Giving*.

Chicken Wings -By Lori Curry

As found in Asbury's Feast of Goodness Cookbook

1 (5 -oz.) bottle of soy sauce


2 T honey

1 T brown sugar

1 tsp. ginger

1 tsp. lemon juice

Let stand in refrigerator 12-24 hours. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until done.







Southwestern Potato Salad-By Mary Lou Rothfuss

4 lbs. small red potatoes

Salt

3 T Olive Oil

2 tsp/ cumin seeds

1 T minced jalapeno chile

1/2 tsp. minced garlic

1/4 c. fresh lime juice

1 tsp. grated lime peel

1/2 tsp. pepper

1 (8-oz) container of sour cream

1/2 c. plain low-fat yogurt

1/2 c. finely chopped red onion

1/4 c. chopped fresh parsley

Cook potatoes in boiling water until tender. Drain. Meanwhile, heat oil in small saucepan over medium heat. Add cumin seeds and cook until fragrant, 30 seconds. Remove from heat and stir in jalapeno and garlic. Whisk in lime juice and peel, 2 teaspoons salt and the pepper. Put in large bowl. Slice warm potatoes 1/2 inch thick and toss with dressing. Cool. Stir in remaining ingredients.
