Time flies! We are entering the last month of 2023. Time passes more quickly as we age, and we can keenly feel its fleeting nature. As David Vacchina approached his 100th birthday, I had the privilege of visiting him. In the course of our conversation, he shared, "I used to say that I live one day at a time, but now I live an hour at a time." It serves as a reminder that we only truly live in the present moment. Echoing the sentiments of Eckhart

Tolle, "Realize deeply that the present moment is all you ever have." However, our ability to fully embrace the present is often hindered by past regrets and future worries. Yet, God created us to live in the present.

Advent, a season often filled with concerns about organizing busy schedules and finding the perfect Christmas gifts, is an opportune time to reflect. While the act of giving gifts expresses our love for others, sometimes the most significant gift is our very presence. During my summer visit to Korea, I stayed at my mother's house. "The Holy Living One is with you." (Isaiah 41:10)

While we may not always feel God's presence in the midst of our struggles, challenges, and busyness, Advent invites us to practice being present and mindful of God's presence. Throughout this Advent season, we will explore the spiritual practice of Christian mindfulness with the book, "Right Here, Right Now." I invite you to join our advent book study. My prayer is that we can uncover the gift of being present with hope, peace, joy, and love during this blessed Christmas season.

Sweet Potato Casserole from Linda Mills

- 3 cups mashed sweet potato
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- ¼ cup sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt

Topping:

- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- ¼ cup margarine, softened
- 1 cup pecans or walnuts

Directions:

- 1. Combine sweet potatoes with the next 4 ingredients in a 1 ½ quart casserole dish
- 2. Mix topping ingredients, sprinkle on top of potato
- 3. Bake at 350º for 45 minutes




Pumpkin Sheet Cake from Marion Lightsey

1 can pumpkin
 2 cups sugar
 1 cup canola oil
 4 eggs
 2 cups flour
 2 teaspoons baking soda
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

½ teaspoon salt

Directions:

- 1. Beat pumpkin, sugar and oil together
- 2. Add lightly beaten eggs
- 3. Mix dry ingredients together, add to pumpkin mixture, beat well
- 4. Place batter in greased jelly roll pan (15x10x1")
- 5. Bake at 350º for 25-30 minutes
- 6. Let cool, then frost with cream cheese frosting or dust with powdered sugar
