The Sabbath Practice







Memorial Day is about a month away, and it marks the unofficial start to the summer season. I bet many of you have already planned your summer vacation since we feel that everything is getting back to normal. As we prepare for the vacation season, I hope you will think about the meaning of Sabbath.

When I first started my ministry in Korea, my father, a pastor, gave me advice: "Relax. Ministry is like a marathon rather than sprints." This was the most valuable advice I have ever received for my pastoral ministry. I tried to teach Juhee this wisdom, but as you know, a husband cannot teach a wife. Juhee is like an energizer bunny, so she was busy with everything and running everywhere. So my task was to slow her down. We agreed to intentionally practice Sabbath. On Fridays, we went to Rocky Point State Park and walked around the park for an hour. That was good enough to refresh ourselves.

Keeping the Sabbath is important, not because it increases the effectiveness of work, but because it is our authentic call from God. In Exodus 20, God speaks to the Israelites: "Remember the Sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work" (8-10). This is God's gift to the Israelites who did not have a Sabbath at all while they were slaves in Egypt. Sabbath observance reminds Israelites of God's gift of liberation from Egyptian oppression. Dr. Clair Wolfteich wrote, "Sabbath represents freedom and justice for all creation, recognition of the dignity of all created beings" (Sabbath in the City, 41). We need to rest well, pausing from all forms of work while remembering God's creation and liberation.

As you prepare for the summer season, take some time to reflect on the Sabbath practices you would like to incorporate into your routine and how you will keep the Sabbath holy. Remember that worship is the best traditional practice to keep the Sabbath holy. While summer is a time for relaxation, it is not a time to take a break from church, but rather a time for a Sabbath from work and stress. I pray that you find the strength to slow down, take a deep breath, and be still in God's presence, whether you are staying close to home or traveling to new places. May God bless you abundantly and fill your soul with His peace and joy.

We never know how one of our small bags will impact someone we meet. We plan to continue this ministry throughout the summer months. The following items are needed at this time.

Travel toothbrush and toothpaste kits
Travel size deodorant
Protein bars
Travel size tissue
One more case of water
Protein kits (chicken or tuna - available at Dollar Tree)

Right now we have enough hand sanitizer, lip balm and peanut butter crackers.

We would also like to say a special thanks to Linda Cameron. When we ran out of cards to include in the bags, she stepped up and has been writing more cards for us.

We would also like to thank everyone who has participated in this ministry.

Korean UMC has also been distributing their own Bags of Caring.



Baked French Toast

Ingredients

- 1 loaf cinnamon swirl bread
- 3/4 cup dried cranberries or raisins
- 6 eggs
- 3 cups half and half or milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla

cinnamon sugar

whipped butter

maple syrup

Directions

- Cube bread, place in greased 3 quart shallow baking dish and mix in cranberries or raisins
- 2. Mix eggs, milk, vanilla and pour over bread and fruit mixture, cover and refrigerate overnight
- 3. Bake uncovered at 350° for 45 minutes (until set in center)

Sprinkle with cinnamon and serve with butter and syrup


